CDD Cox's Bazar Operation

Background:

CDD in Partnership with CBM started its health and rehabilitation services for both Rohingyas and Host communities in Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh. The project has two-pronged approach by prioritizing rehabilitation service provision and disability mainstreaming.

The focus here is on psychosocial services and the provision of rehabilitation services that includes physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech & language therapy, eye screening, hearing screening and provision of assistive devices as well as the strengthening referral services.

The mainstreaming activities are to promote the inclusion of people with disabilities along with strengthening the Age and Disability Working Group and the rights of persons with disabilities through formation and capacity building of Self-help groups (SHGs) and Disability Committees.

Project Target Beneficiaries:

- First Phase: 30,000;
- Extension Phase: 10,000

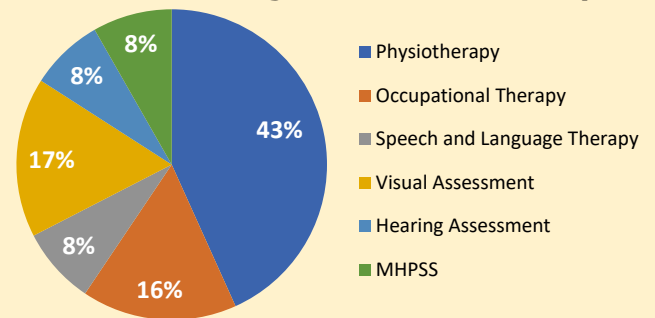
Project Duration:

- Extension Phase: June 2020 - December 2021

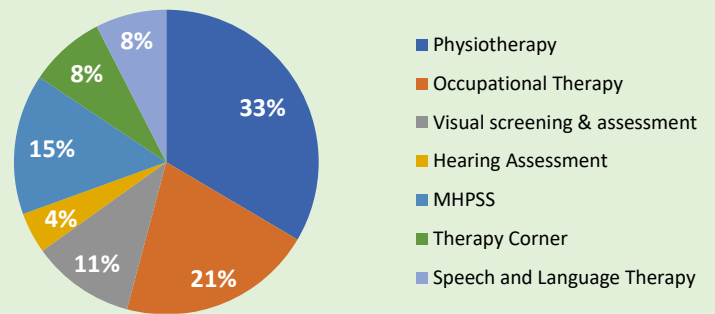
Rehabilitation services

During the month of October, three Home Based Rehabilitation (HBR) teams, all of our main camp staff & bus camp staff were on board.

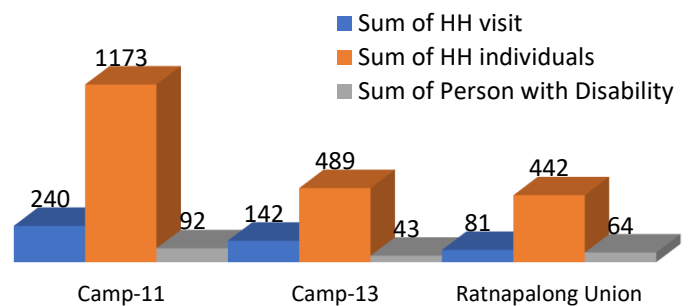
Service wise coverage at Host community
