Background

CDD in Partnership with CBM started its health and rehabilitation services for both Rohingyas and Host communities in Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh. The project has two-pronged approach by prioritizing rehabilitation service provision and disability mainstreaming.

The focus here is on psychosocial services and the provision of rehabilitation services that includes physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech & language therapy, eye screening, hearing screening and provision of assistive devices as well as the strengthening referral services.

The mainstreaming activities are to promote the inclusion of people with disabilities along with strengthening the Age and Disability Working Group and the rights of persons with disabilities through formation and capacity building of Selfhelp groups (SHGs) and Disability Committees.




Rehabilitation services

During the month of October, three Home Based Rehabilitation (HBR) teams, all of our main camp staff & bus camp staff were on board.

In November 2020, a total of 2,585 service sessions provided to the 645 beneficiaries with 50.60% male, and 49.40% female and persons with disabilities, almost 80.15% of total session. Within 645 Clint's, Physiotherapy 124, Occupational Therapy 53, Speech & Language Therapy 15, Visual Assessment 243, Hearing Assessment 150 and Psychosocial Counseling 60.




