

Background:

CDD in Partnership with CBM started its health and rehabilitation services for both Rohingyas and Host communities in Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh. The project has two-pronged approach by prioritizing rehabilitation service provision and disability mainstreaming.

The focus here is on psychosocial services and the provision of rehabilitation services that includes physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech & language therapy, eye screening, hearing screening and provision of assistive devices as well as the strengthening referral services.

The mainstreaming activities are to promote the inclusion of people with disabilities along with strengthening the Age and Disability Working Group and the rights of persons with disabilities through formation and capacity building of Self-help groups (SHGs) and Disability Support Committees (DSC).

Extension Phase: June 2020 - December 2021


Rehabilitation services During the month of December, three Home Based Rehabilitation (HBR) teams, all of our main camp staff & bus camp staff were on board. In December 2020, a total of 2,360 service sessions provided to the 549 beneficiaries with 50.45% male, 49.55% female and persons with disabilities, almost 82.22% of total session. Within 549 Clint's, Physiotherapy 107, Occupational Therapy 29, Speech & Language Therapy 12, Visual Assessment 173, Hearing Assessment 100, Psychosocial Counseling 68 and 60 referral.




Service wise coverage: Rohingya Community



A total of 51 different assistive devices like Iron Ramp, Spike Ball, Bed Pan, Uring Pot, and Walking Stick have been provided among 47 (female 23, male 24) beneficiaries of Rohingya and the host community.
