Project Interventions



Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities

- **9** monthly meetings of total 3 Self-help Groups (SHG) held at Southkhali Union of Bagerhat District
- **45** persons with disabilities and their caregiver participated in the meetings



Capacity Enhancing of Disaster Management Committees

- **30** number meetings of Ward Disaster Management Committees (WDMCs) held at Savar Municipality, Dhaka North City Corporation (DNCC) and Southkhali Union of Bagerhat District
- **1** quarterly meetings of Municipal Disaster Management Committees (MDMC) held at Savar Municipality



Training Program

25 Cyclone Preparedness Program (CPP) Volunteers including 1 person with low vision from Southkhali Union of Sahrankhola Upazila under Bagerhat District participated 3 days Training on Trainers (ToT) on Effective Communication, Search, Rescue and Evacuation with Persons with disabilities



Health and Rehabilitation Service

- **28** persons with disabilities received 355 time different types of home-based services at Gaibandha and Bagerhat District
- **17** people including 8 persons with disabilities were referred for general medical services at Southkhali Union
- **9** persons with disabilities received assistive device and device repair support at Southkhali Union



Disability inclusive DRR & CCA

- **10** number of disability inclusive contingency plans of 9 WDMC and UDMC finalized at Southkhali Union
- **1** Bi-monthly meeting of Southkhali Union Disability inclusive Climate Change Adaptation Working Group (SUDiCCAWG) took place

Lobbying, Networking & Advocacy

Relief Support from Local Philanthropy Group

In W-23 of Dhaka North City Corporation (DNCC), project communicated with local philanthropy groups for supporting persons with disabilities who suffered due to COVID-19. As a result of successful networking, 90 persons including 89 persons with disabilities received food support at Ward no 23 of Dhaka North City Corporation (DNCC).

Persons with disabilities are a diverse group with different kinds of impairments and their needs also differ depending on individual circumstances and capacities. During climate-induced disasters, persons with disabilities experience the same impacts as other experience the same impacts as other community people, but they are far less able to cope with these changes. In this context, climate change disproportionately affects them and their organisations.


Bangladesh is already facing m impacts of climate change, and is cited as one of the most climate vulnerable countries in the world¹. The country's coastal region, inhabiting approximately 40 million people, is especially vulnerable because of its geo-physical characteristics and disadvantaged socio-political conditions that often limit socio-political conditions that often limit people's access to resources^{2,3}. Research also shows that the country's people have remarkable ability to cope with natural disasters'-8. However, regardless of their abilities, poor and vulnerable populations like persons with disabilities bear the most severe brunt of climate change and are also often excluded from being included in excluded from being included in adaptation measures

- resources coupled with lack of skills, knowledge and limited alternative livelihood livelihoods of coastal communities including persons
- in climate smart agricultural methods are essential to reduce
- loss of livelihood.
 Awareness campaigns and policy advocacy needs to be done for making disability-inclusive law and policies while ensuring effective implementation.
 Strengthening institutional capacities and capacity building of community people is needed on CCA and the rights of persons with disabilities for ensuring their equal participation, empowerment and inclusion in empowerment and inclusion in CCA measures.

Policy brief on Disability inclusive Climate Change Adaptation (DiCCA) developed on highlighting climate change related vulnerabilities and its impact on the coastal community including persons with disabilities, gaps of inclusion of persons with disabilities in adaptation measures to climate change.



Prodip Proceedings Towards a Better Life

Prodip Saha who is a person with mental illness who lives in Savar Municipality. In 2009, due to family pressure, financial crisis and depression, Prodip became mentally unstable. At that time, he was unable to talk with anyone. He used to spend his days sitting idle and quietly. Sometimes he broke materials of the house.

On 2020, he came to the mental health assessment camp of project. In the camp he was assessed by the psychiatrist. He received 4 months medicine support from the project as per prescription by psychiatrist. Also, in 2021 through the linkage of project he received psychiatrist and counselling support from the Day Care Centre of CRP for 2 months without any cost.

Now a positive change took place in his behavior and he returned to sound life. He used to talk with his mother, father and fraternizes with neighbors. Now he is regularly receiving phone calls and talking with his relatives and friends. Her mother is expecting that he will be able to start tuition very soon and will start to contribute to reduce the financial crisis and sorrow of their family. Right now, he started working in a medicine shop of his relative.

"Previously, Prodip didn't go to outside of the house, never fraternized with the community people, broke materials, and talked alone. But right now, he takes medicine by himself, talks with us and neighbors. I am extremely happy to see that my son is recovered from his illness."











Subir Kumar Saha
